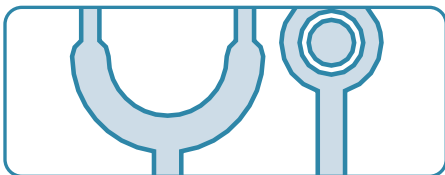

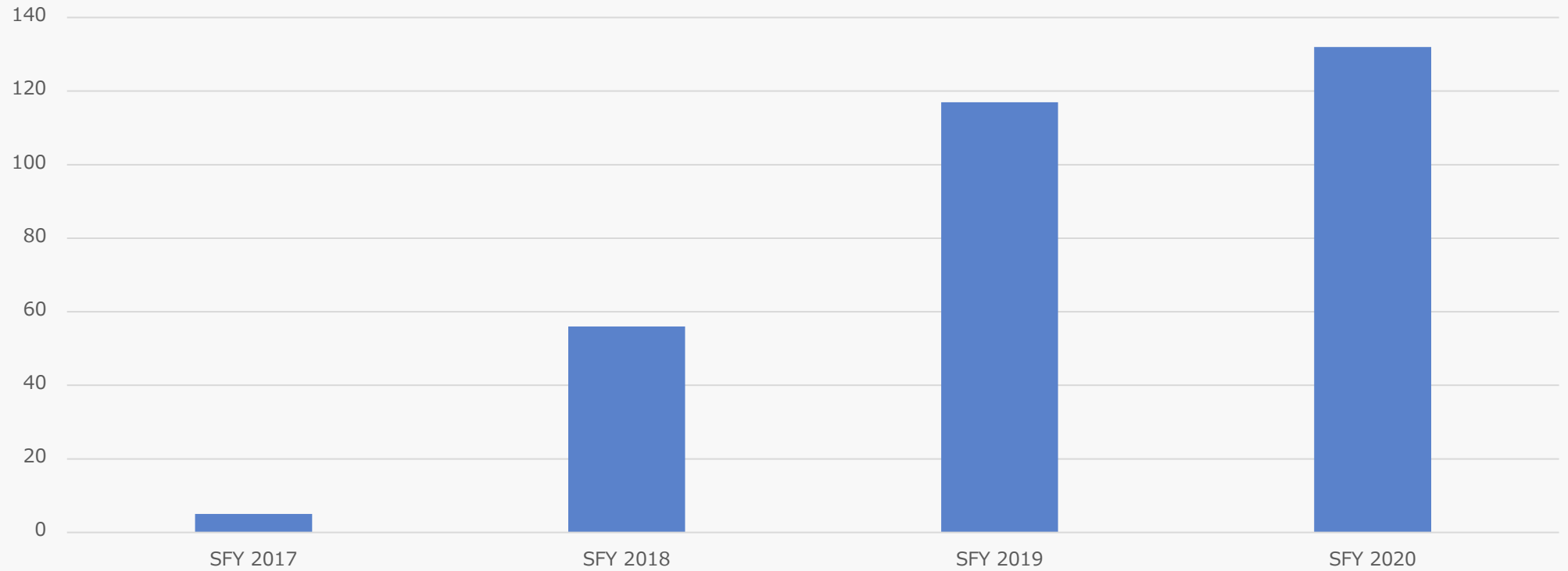

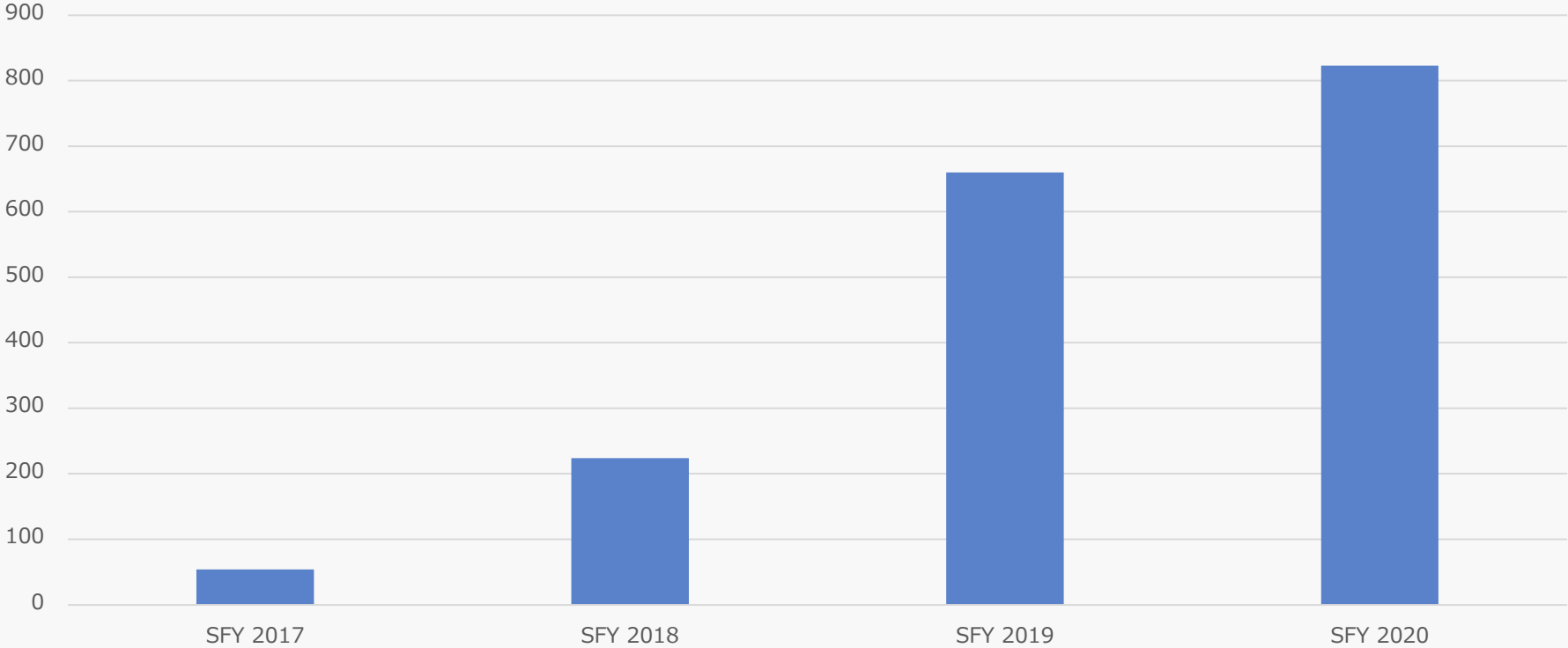

Number of Providers Waivered to Prescribe Buprenorphine



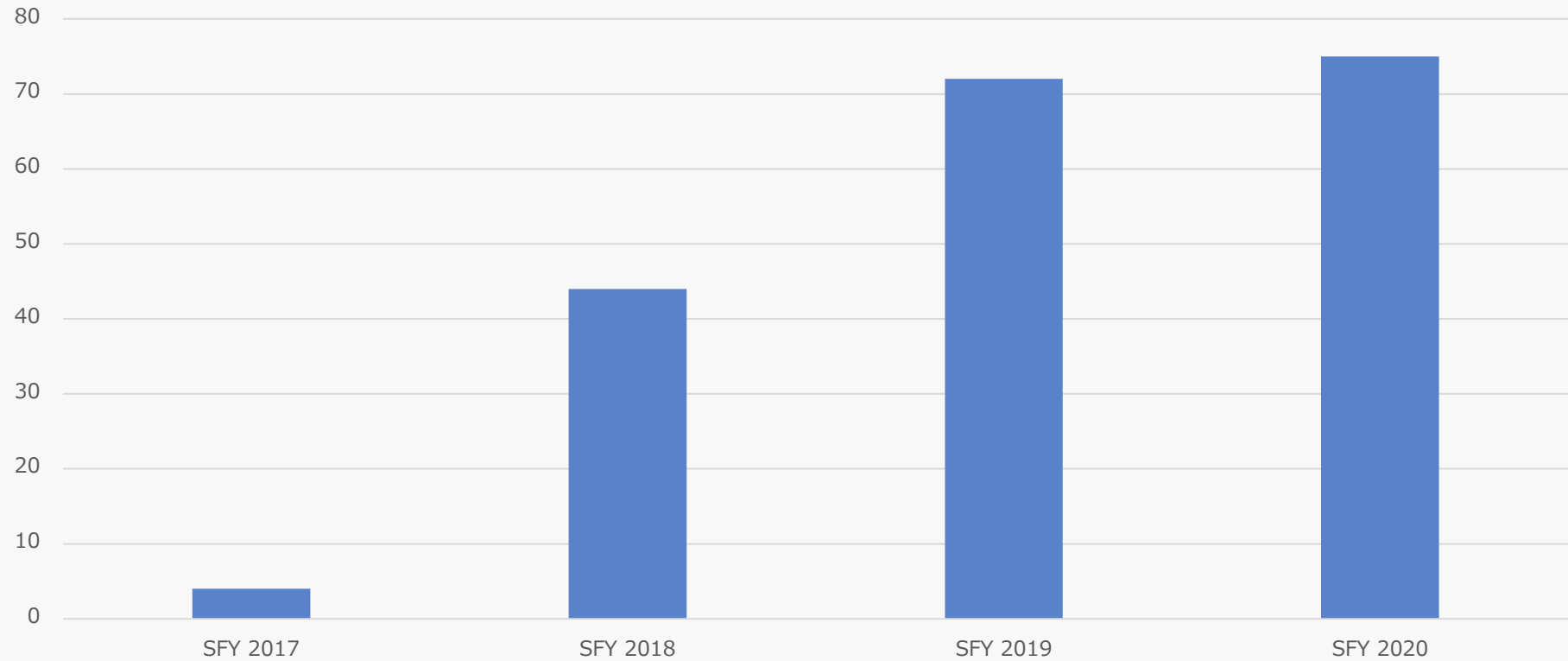
MAT CoP Achievements

Number of Patients Served by the Project



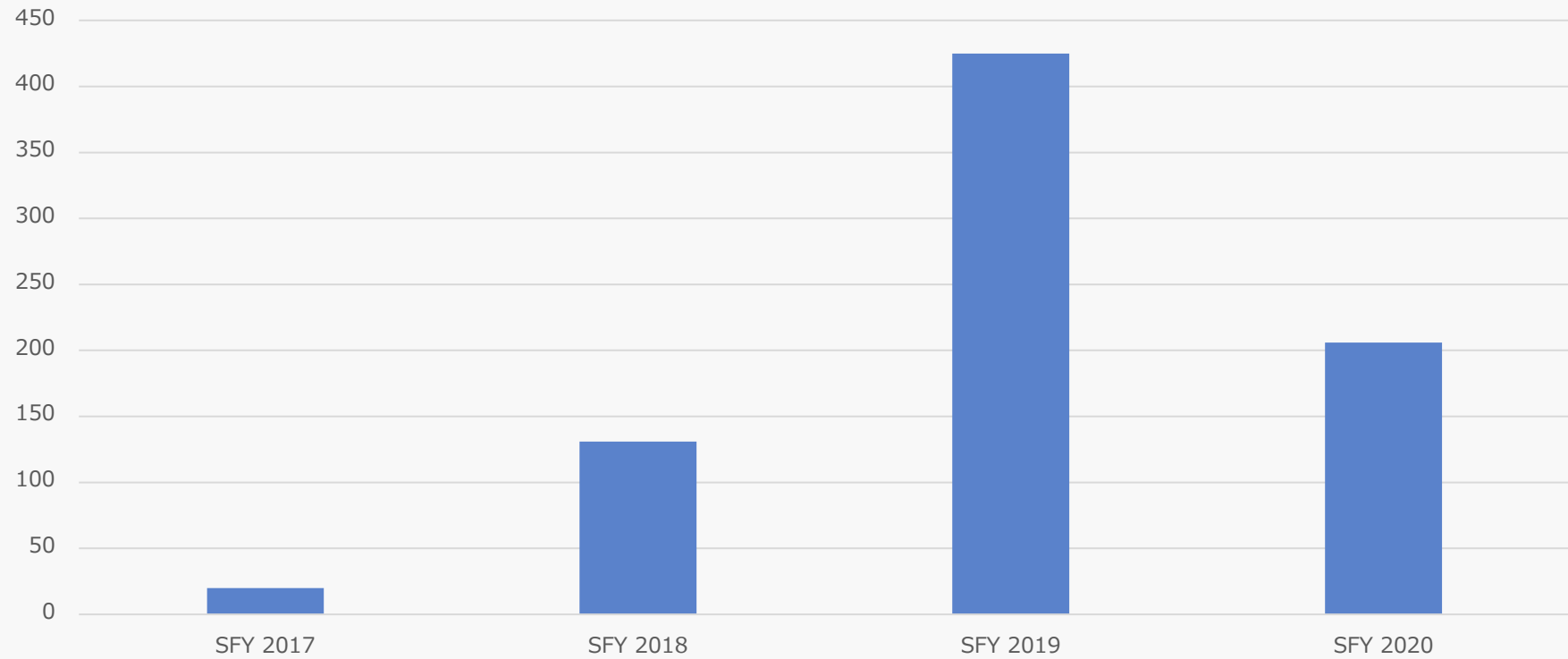

The NEW Hospital System Addictions Care CoP will:

- Promote the development of interdisciplinary hospital systems that **identify**, **engage**, **treat**, and **coordinate** services for people with a SUD to improve patient and hospital outcomes.
- Support hospital staff in using “reachable moments” to enhance patient-centered care and hospital outcomes by providing MAT and other interventions and linking patients to SUD care and harm reduction support after discharge.

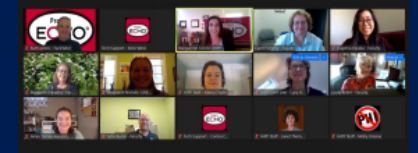
